

# JAMES ALPHA MANAGED RISK DOMESTIC EQUITY FUND

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The month of June was all about Brexit. The results of the month-end vote to leave the European Union (EU) came as a surprise and markets quickly fell more than 5% due to fears of a potential immediate breakup of the EU. Once the market realized that any exit of Great Britain would be orderly and any contagion fears were over blown, the market recovered its losses to close flat for the month. The S&P 500 index closed the month up 0.26%. The Dow Jones Industrial Average fared better, closing up 0.95%. The markets were extremely volatile, which gave opportunity to an active manager.

The James Alpha Managed Risk Domestic Equity Fund was up 0.61% in June versus 0.26% in the S&P 500 Total Return Index. The index is now up 1.86% versus -1.21% in the Fund since inception. In addition to the outperformance, the max drawdown in the Fund was -5.40% versus -8.36% in the index. Heading into July, the Fund's strategy is to continue downside protection while limiting the short call strategy as a result of the contraction in option premium levels due to seasonality.





## DEFINITIONS

**Brexit:** An abbreviation of "British exit" that mirrors the term Grexit, refers to the possibility of Britain's withdrawal from the European Union.

**CBOE Volatility Index (VIX):** Shows the market's expectation of 30-day volatility. It is constructed using the implied volatilities of a wide range of S&P 500 index options. This volatility is meant to be forward-looking and is calculated from both calls and puts. The VIX is a widely used measure of market risk and is often referred to as the "investor fear gauge."

**Federal Open Market Committee (FOMC):** The branch of the Federal Reserve Board that determines the direction of monetary policy. The FOMC meets eight times per year to set key interest rates, such as the discount rate, and to decide whether to increase or decrease the money supply, which the Fed does by buying and selling government securities.

**S&P 500 Index:** An index of 500 stocks chosen for market size, liquidity and industry grouping, among other factors. The S&P 500 is designed to be a leading indicator of U.S. equities and is meant to reflect the risk/return characteristics of the large cap universe.

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**Volatility:** A statistical measure of the dispersion of returns for a given security or market index. Volatility can either be measured by using the standard deviation or variance between returns from that same security or market index.
